### Active Software Updates

- Max OS X Update 10.4.9 - Green Light! We've begun installing this major update for MacMedics clients. There are risks when installing a major update like this one, and we're only installing it on Macs that have been completely serviced, and certified. If you have questions, talk to your MacMedics consultant, and read our page at the bottom of this article on running Apple software updates.
- Security Update 2007-005 1.1(Universal & PPC) – Yellow Light! An updated version of this patch was quickly made available by Apple to address some issues in the initial release. There have been problems with both of Apple's recent security updates, so while we're anxious to patch security holes, we don't want to cause more problems than we're trying to avoid. This an update that we suggest running as it address multiple security issues, but reports of problems regarding this update are still ongoing.
- Security Update (QuickTime 7.1.6) Green Light!
- iTunes 7.2 Green Light! We feel this is safe to install, but if you're a heavy iTunes user, you might want to hold off, as there have been so reported issues.
- Microsoft Office 2004 11.3.5 - Red Light! Serious issues, stay away from this update for now.

- Apple released a new version of iTunes that supports DRM free (unprotected) music downloads for \$1.29 per track.
- Apple announced that Apple TV owners will be able to wirelessly stream video content from Google's YouTube service to their televisions starting next month. Also, the Apple TV will now be available in a 160 GB version.
- Apple CEO Steve Jobs is scheduled to deliver the keynote speech at WWDC 2007 being held in San Francisco next Monday. It is expected that he will divulge secret details on some of the features in Mac OS X Leopard.
